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1. Overview of Business Results and Others

(1) Overview of Business Results for the Six Months Ended September 30, 2025

In the six months ended September 30, 2025, the Japanese economy continued to show a stable trend, but there are signs of weakness in business confidence due to the impact of trade policies in various countries. The United States has continued to show gradual growth until now, but a slowdown in the labor market has become evident. The European economy is on a recovery trend, but the manufacturing industry, particularly in Germany, is sluggish due to the impact of the Chinese economic downturn. Going forward, it is expected that the negative impact of tariff policies will spread to the global economy and slow down the economy, but the scale of the impact remains difficult to predict.

Under these circumstances, the Environment Business saw an increase in shipments of automotive-related products due to such factors as last-minute demand in anticipation of tariff hikes, and sales also increased due to the recognition of revenue from construction projects for Industrial Process Business. In the Digital Society Business, shipments of components for semiconductor production equipment increased due to inventory increase of certain customers, despite a setback in plans to build new cutting-edge foundries. In the Energy & Industry Business, sales increased year-on-year due to sales of NAS batteries (sodium-sulfur batteries) to domestic power storage plants in the Energy Storage Business.

As a result, net sales in the six months ended September 30, 2025, increased 9.3% year-on-year to ¥326,204 million. In terms of profits, due to an increase in sales, operating income increased 22.7% year on year to ¥48,700 million and ordinary income increased 21.6% year on year to ¥46,667 million, net income attributable to owners of the parent decreased 7.7% year on year to ¥23,870 million, due to the recognition of business restructuring expenses as an extraordinary loss associated with the discontinuation of the manufacturing and sales activities of the NAS batteries under its Energy Storage Business.

By segment, net sales increased 2.5% year on year in the Environment Business to ¥197,398 million, and operating income increased 5.1% year on year to ¥37,106 million. In the Digital Society Business, net sales increased 23.6% year on year to ¥97,827 million. Operating income increased 157.2% year on year to ¥13,506 million. In the Energy & Industry Business, net sales increased 17.9% year on year to ¥32,120 million and operating loss was ¥1,773 million (operating loss of ¥865 million in the same period of the previous fiscal year).

(2) Summary of Financial Position for the Six Months Ended September 30, 2025

As of September 30, 2025, total assets were ¥1,181,377 million, an increase of ¥38,391 million from the previous fiscal yearend. This was mainly due to increases in securities, investment securities, and cash and deposits despite a decrease in Notes and accounts receivable-trade, and contract assets and inventories.

Total liabilities increased by ¥259 million from the previous fiscal year-end to ¥415,739 million. This was mainly due to decreases in short-term borrowings and current portion of long-term borrowings despite an increase in long-term borrowings.

Total net assets stood at ¥765,638 million, or ¥38,132 million higher than the previous fiscal year-end, due to increase in foreign currency translation adjustment, retained earnings and valuation difference on available -for-sale securities.

(3) Explanation of Future Statements including Forecasts for Consolidated Financial Statements

Regarding the full-year forecasts for financial statements, demand for automotive-related products in the Environment Business is expected to decrease in the second half due to a decline in automobile sales caused by the impact of tariffs. In the Digital Society Business, the demand of inventory increase of certain customers for components for semiconductor production equipment is also expected to decline in the second half. However, net sales, operating income, and ordinary income are expected to exceed previous forecasts due to factors such as the mitigation of the direct impact of tariffs through price revisions. The forecast for net income attributable to owners of the parent was left unchanged from the forecast announced in April 2025, reflecting both the recognition of business restructuring expenses as an extraordinary loss associated with the discontinuation of the manufacturing and sales activities of the NAS batteries, and the gain on sales from the reduction of strategic shareholdings.

The assumed exchange rates for the second half of the fiscal year are ¥145 to the U.S. dollar and ¥170 to the euro. (Average exchange rates for the year: ¥146 to the U.S. dollar and ¥169 to the euro)

(Additional Information)

(Discontinuation of Manufacturing and Sales Activities of NAS Batteries)

At the Board of Directors meeting held on October 31, 2025, NGK INSULATORS, LTD. (the "Company") has resolved to discontinue the manufacturing and sales activities of NAS batteries under its Energy Storage Business, and to cease accepting new orders.

1. Reason for Business Discontinuation

The Company has promoted the Energy Storage Business with the aim of contributing to the resolution of medium to long-term social issues such as the spread of renewable energy and the realization of a decarbonized society, through the manufacturing and sales of NAS batteries which is the large-capacity energy storage systems.

NAS batteries are capable of long-duration, large-capacity energy storage and are known for their long lifetime and high reliability. They were first commercialized globally in 2002 and have been continuously developed as proprietary products manufactured exclusively by the Company.

In response to the expansion of the energy storage market, driven by the global spread of renewable energy, the Company has been collaborating since 2019 with BASF, a leading chemical manufacturer in Germany, to improve battery performance, reduce costs, and strengthen its global sales network. Furthermore, to address the anticipated growth in energy storage demand, the Company engaged in discussions with BASF to expand supply capacity and achieve cost reductions by inviting participation from other companies. However, these discussions were discontinued in September 2025.

It is expected to take time for stable and continuous demand to emerge for long-duration, large-capacity energy storage, where NAS batteries have distinct advantages. In addition, due to various factors, including recent surges in material costs and intensifying competition with lithium-ion batteries, the Company has determined that stable operations and profitability will be difficult to achieve.

Based on these factors, the Company resolved at the Board of Directors meeting on October 31, 2025, to discontinue the manufacturing and sales activities of NAS batteries.

4. Significant impact on business operations resulting from the discontinuation

The Company will discontinue the new production of all NAS Batteries. For orders already received, the Company will proceed with shipments and deliveries from existing inventory upon confirmation of each customer's intent. Although sales activities targeting new projects will be discontinued, the Company will continue to respond to ongoing discussions, limited to cases where the respective project is close to order placement and delivery can be fulfilled within existing inventory. Supply of maintenance parts for products that have already been delivered or are scheduled to be delivered will continue to be provided responsibly. For products currently in use,

supply of maintenance parts will be available only for those that have been properly maintained.

During the six months consolidated accounting period, ended September 30, 2025, ¥11,693 million was recorded as business restructuring expenses under extraordinary losses associated with the discontinuation.

1. Lawsuit filed against the company

On July 6, 2021, a lawsuit was filed against the Company in Nagoya District Court and the Company received the complaint on October 29, 2021 that PT Paiton Energy ("Paiton"), its insurance companies and their reinsurer companies ("the Plaintiffs") filed a claim against the Company for compensation for damages of US\$151,392,337.48 (¥16,828,772,234) and the amount of the relevant delay charges. Thereafter, the Plaintiffs issued petition for amendment of claim on January 11, 2022, the amount of the claim increased by US\$41.36 (¥4,796) to US\$151,392,378.84 (¥16,828,777,030) and the relevant delay changes. The value of yen for the damage sought is the amount stated in the complaint and the petition for amendment of claim and is converted into yen at a different exchange rate from that used by the Company to prepare the consolidated financial statements.

In January 2018, a fire incident allegedly occurred in a transformer ("Transformer") installed in a thermal power plant ("Power Plant") in Indonesia operated by Paiton. In connection with this accident, the plaintiffs filed a claim against the Company for damages and relevant delay charges based on alleged product liability and torts.

The Company was a distributor of the bushing (manufactured in 2010) incorporated in the Transformer. The Company delivered the bushing to a third-party transformer manufacturer that incorporated the same into the Transformer. The Transformer was then delivered to the Power Plant through a plant engineering manufacturer. The company has consistently maintained that there is no basis for liability and has sought dismissal of the Plaintiffs' claims.

After the subsequent proceedings, in October 2025, the Nagoya District Court rendered a judgment that dismissed all claims brought by the Plaintiffs.

This judgment fully upholds the company's position, and the company currently anticipates no impact on our financial results.

*1. Business restructuring expenses

The expense is associated with the discontinuation of the manufacturing and sales activities of NAS batteries under its Energy Storage Business. The main components include expenses related to the valuation and disposal of inventories, as well as costs for services that the Company is responsible for providing.

(Significant Changes in Stockholder's Equity)

The Company acquired 2,492,200 shares of its own shares based on the resolution at the meeting of the Board of Directors held on July 31, 2025. As a result, during the six months ended September 30, 2025, treasury shares increased by ¥5,418 million, and as of September 30, 2025, treasury shares stood at ¥14,246 million.

(Discontinuation of Manufacturing and Sales Activities of NAS Batteries)

At the Board of Directors meeting held on October 31, 2025, NGK INSULATORS, LTD. has resolved to discontinue the manufacturing and sales activities of NAS batteries under its Energy Storage Business, and to cease accepting new orders.

(Organizational restructuring)

NGK INSULATORS, LTD. (the "Company") hereby announces that, at the Board of Directors meeting held on October 31, 2025, it has resolved to conduct a company split (simplified absorption-type company split), effective on April 1, 2026 (planned), whereby the sales division of its wholly owned subsidiary, NGK ELECTRONICS DEVICES, INC. ("NGKED"), will be succeeded by the Company (the "Company Split"). In addition, it will implement an absorption-type merger (the "Merger"), under which NGK CERAMIC DEVICE CO., LTD. ("NCDK"), a wholly owned subsidiary of the Company, will be the surviving entity. Through the Merger, NCDK will absorb NGKED and acquire its manufacturing division. (NGKED will be dissolved as a result of the Merger.)

This organizational restructuring will be executed by first implementing the Company Split, followed by the Merger on the same day.

1. Purpose of the Organizational restructuring

The ceramic package segment of the Company's group has, until now, been fully managed by NGKED, which handled development, manufacturing, and sales functions. However, due to the difficulty in securing human resources and the need to improve operational efficiency, maintaining and strengthening competitiveness has become a key challenge. To achieve sustainable growth and enhance competitiveness in the electronics components business, including the ceramic package segment, by fully leveraging the Group's proprietary ceramic technologies, the Company will implement the following organizational restructuring, including the Company Split:

- The Company will succeed the sales division of NGKED through a simplified absorption-type company split, aiming to improve
 efficiency. In addition, the Company will newly take on the development of the ceramic package segment to enhance synergies
 with other fields and strengthen development capabilities.
- It will implement the Merger, under which NCDK, a wholly owned subsidiary of the Company entrusted with manufacturing operations, will be the surviving entity. Through the Merger, NCDK will absorb NGKED and acquire its manufacturing division.
 NGKED will be dissolved as a result of the Merger.

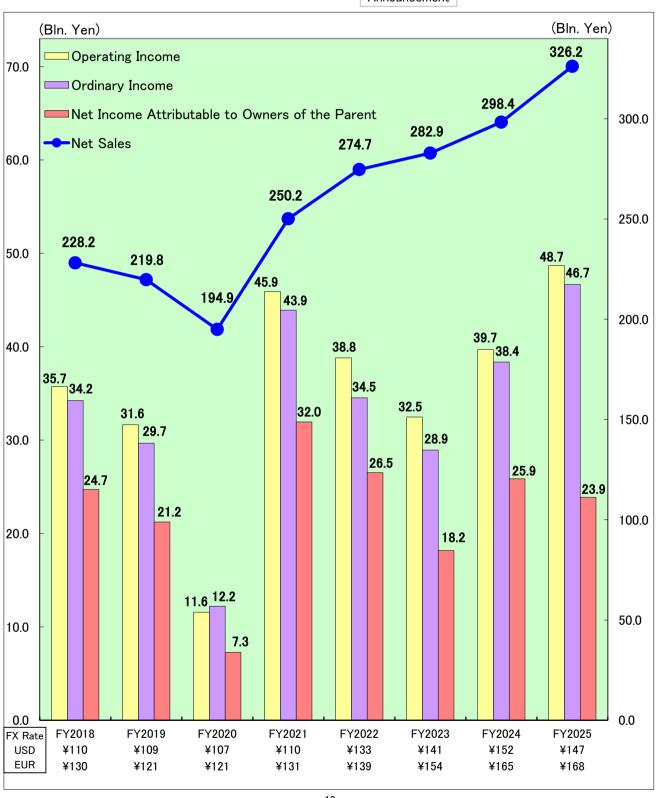
